



Every year, about 1 in 110 births are affected by Congenital Heart Defects (CHDs), or structural abnormalities of the heart, most of which will benefit from heart surgery at some point. CHDs are responsible for 1/3 of all birth defect-related deaths, more than any other birth defect, and sadly 20% of children who make it through birth will not survive past their first birthday. Needless to say, when a child with a CHD is born, their families' lives change forever.

Mended Little Hearts is a program of Mended Hearts, Inc., and has been offering the gift of hope to heart patients, their families and caregivers for more than 50 years. More than 90 Mended Little Hearts groups nationwide meet together to share experiences and emotions so that they can work towards healing. They also have educational speakers so that members can understand how to best care for their child and the best treatment options available for him or her.

Mended Little Hearts of Amarillo is a network of heart families in the Texas, New Mexico & Oklahoma Panhandle that understand and support each other while raising children with heart defects. We provide resources to help families work through overwhelming emotions and move forward to find hope, healing, and laughter.

We were locally chartered in 2009 within the national Mended Little Hearts organization and have been substantially growing our membership since then. Mended Little Hearts of Amarillo has generated great support from our local pediatricians and obstetricians, pediatric cardiologists that care for our children in Amarillo and the DFW area, along with past and present Mayors of Amarillo and the City Commissioners. The national organization does not financially support the groups, so it is up to us to raise money locally to meet our goals. Some of the immediate goals that we have are:

-Nationally trained and accredited volunteer visitors

*visit with families who have children with CHDs in hospitals, by phone and online. The volunteers are family members who have experienced CHDs firsthand. Visits provide support, information and outreach uniquely delivered by a parent who has experienced open-heart surgery or other heart procedures with their own child.

-Bravery Bags

*all children requiring surgery are transported, oftentimes an emergency flight is required, to other facilities outside of Amarillo and have nothing more than the clothes on their backs when they travel with their children hundreds of miles away, most times to Dallas or Ft. Worth. Our Bravery Bags have informational brochures and basic necessities for the families (basic toiletries, snacks, gift cards, comfort items for the children such as bright pillow cases, socks and stuffed animals) We work closely with Mended Little Hearts of Dallas to help provide necessary items to the families that are from the Panhandle.

-Group Meetings

*with educational speakers as well as representatives from other organizations

-Social Events

*picnics, parties and cook-outs so that our children are able to interact with others that are like them and have had open-heart surgeries

-Promote Awareness

*National CHD Awareness Week February 7-14th of each year with the Proclamation from the Amarillo City Commissioners (This year our group was presented the Proclamation at the City Commissioner's February 3rd meeting.)

*We have several Awareness events and heavy media coverage during CHD Awareness Week

-Community Events Members of our group have attended and participated in the American Heart Association Heart Walk, Jump Rope for Heart & Go Red for Women, Coffee Memorial Blood

Spokesperson & the annual Boots N Badges Competition, Hearts & Hogs, Home is Where the Heart Is, Make-A-Wish Chili Cook-off and Car Show

- Provide meals and support** to families staying at the Ronald McDonald House Amarillo
- Sponsor blood drives** and have a strong, personal relationship with Coffee Memorial Blood Center, as the majority of our children have received multiple blood transfusions in their short lives
- Leadership Training** with other group coordinators and national leaders at the Annual Leadership Conference. We also have several Mended **Little** Hearts of Amarillo members that are on the Parent Advisory Board of Children's Medical Center of Dallas and the Board of Directors of the Ronald McDonald House

As Mended **Little** Hearts of Amarillo membership grows, we face the reality that most non-profits do as well. In order to meet the needs and demands of reaching out to families in our area, we realize that it takes financial sponsorship and private donations from companies and individuals to help our organization operate at its full potential. On Friday, May 8th, alongside the Lone Star Runner's Club, we will be having our 4th Annual 5K, the Heart GLO, "Glowing 1 Heartbeat at a Time" at John Stiff Memorial Park. It's going to be a fun filled glow-in-the-dark evening with a family 2.5k Walk and 5K Race!
